Can you treat yourself at home?

For minor injuries and illnesses, treat yourself with a well-stocked medicine cupboard and first aid materials.

Do you need advice or have a minor illness or injury?

Ask your local pharmacist! They can give you advice and treatment for a variety of conditions. They can also prescribe some medicines.

Do you need urgent advice but it's not an emergency?

Call **NHS 111** and they will direct you to the most appropriate service for you.

Do you need to see a doctor?

Call your local GP practice, visit the Wilson Health Centre (GP surgery with walk-in services). If you need to see your GP out of hours call **NHS 111**.

Do you have a very serious/life threatening illness or injury

Call 999 or visit your local A&E department.

At the hospital

- If you need emergency care fast—you will be seen by health professionals in the emergency department.
- If your problem is not medically an emergency, you will be seen by health professionals in the *urgent care centre*.
- You may also be redirected from A&E to a more appropriate service.
